The words resonate even more personally for me because I was a professional figure skater. I've literally fallen hundreds, maybe thousands of times — on the ice and in life. In my younger years, I judged myself harshly for falling, thinking it meant failure. But as I've grown in wisdom and strength, I've come to see each fall as a gift — an invitation to rise stronger, more refined, and more rooted in purpose. I've learned that those who achieve the greatest success are simply the ones who've gotten up the most. That's where the real glory lies.

When times are rough in business where do you find the strength to keep going?

ANGELA KUNG:
First and foremost, I turn to God. I pray for guidance, for peace, for clarity — and I always receive what I need, even if it's not in the form I expected. My faith is my anchor. Church, scripture, and simply sitting in God's presence remind me that I am always loved, always protected, and never alone. I also lean into the people who've stood by me through everything. My husband has been my rock — steady, loyal, always there no matter what. My father is another pillar of strength, and I'm grateful for the incredible foundation he gave me. My two sisters are a constant source of love and support as well. And while my mother has passed, I know she's still with me — she's one of my angels now. I feel her guiding me from the other side, offering strength, comfort, and wisdom in ways that only a mother can. She still shows up when I need her most, and I know she has a hand in the miracles I experience. I lean into my friends, and my incredible team at the wellness center — people who don't just show up for work, but show up for the mission. Their loyalty, passion, and genuine care are part of what carries me forward on the hardest days. I also find strength by leaning into love — the energy of love itself. When I feel overwhelmed,



I intentionally seek peace so that I can gain clarity. One of my greatest gifts in that area is my dog, Charlie. He's not just a pet — he's a soul companion. His presence brings me back to calm, to joy, and to what really matters. Nature is another place I go to heal and recharge. Sitting outside on my egg-crate swing, surrounded by stillness and beauty, helps me reset. I also turn to tools like self-help books, guided meditations, and journaling — they help me process and return to my center. And then there's movement — one of my purest forms of spiritual alignment. Whether it's dancing in freedom or gliding across the ice, movement brings me back to myself. Ice skating especially is a sacred release for me — it's how I reset, realign, and reconnect with my spirit in a way nothing else can. It's medicine. I also tap into my spiritual gifts — clearing negative energy, working through trauma, releasing limiting beliefs, and reaching out to other healers when needed. I listen closely for divine messages,



because I believe the universe is always speaking to us when we get quiet enough to hear. Above all, I remind myself why I do this. When doubts creep in, I shift my mindset, release fear, and trust in the bigger picture. I believe that challenges are not here to defeat us — they're here to grow us. I don't shy away from hard times. I walk through them, armed with faith, community, love, movement, and a fierce sense of purpose. I know that everything I face is leading me somewhere greater — and that God has my back, always.

Del Wayne:
What advice would you give to a young up-and-coming entrepreneur?



ANGELA KUNG:
Always remember how powerful you are when you're aligned with your heart and your higher purpose. When your goals come from passion, you tap into a force much greater than just hustle — you tap into divine flow. So don't give up. Even when things feel stuck, there's always a way forward. Challenges aren't signs to quit — they're opportunities to grow, innovate, and evolve. Don't judge yourself when you fall or stumble — applaud yourself for growing through it. Every "mistake" is really just a stepping stone to mastery. Stay connected to your higher power, and always believe in yourself, even when others can't see your vision yet. Also — let it be fun. Play smart so you don't burn out. Work hard, yes — but work wise. Learn to delegate early. Let go of the things you don't need to control. Trust your team, but expect



greatness from them — and they will rise to meet it. Above all, be true to yourself and operate with the highest integrity in everything you do. That's what builds legacy. That's what people remember. And that's what wins — long term.

What would this chapter of your life be called?

ANGELA KUNG:
"The Beginning." Everything before now feels like the prelude — the training ground, the sacred initiation. But this is where it truly begins. I'm living in the magic of flow, fully in my genius zone, allowing my talents and gifts to be expressed with no limits, no shame, and no more hiding. For the first time, the world is seeing my light at full capacity — because I finally gave myself permission to shine. I've released the shame that once kept me small. I no longer fear what others think. I'm no longer trying to fit into boxes that were never built for me. I remember who I am — a creation made in the image of God — and I refuse to let ego or fear hold me hostage anymore.
